#### Key Events in May for Military Families:

•Children of Fallen Patriots Day: Observed on May 13th, this day honors the children of military members who have died while serving their country.

•VE Day: May 8th marks the day of Victory in Europe during World War II, a time to celebrate the end of the war in Europe.

•Mother's Day: not solely a military-related observance, Mother's Day on the second Sunday of May is a time to appreciate the contributions of military mothers and their families.

•Loyalty Day: Observed on May 1st, this day is a time for citizens to reaffirm their loyalty to the country and remember their heritage.

•Silver Star Banner Day: Observed on May 1st, this day recognizes the sacrifices of ill, wounded, and dying members of the military, as well as those awarded the Silver Star Medal and their families.

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#### Key Events in May for Military Families:

•National Military Appreciation Month: This month-long celebration, officially recognized in 1999, is dedicated to acknowledging the contributions of service members.

•<u>Military Spouse Appreciation Day</u>: Typically observed on the Friday before Mother's Day, this day recognizes the significant sacrifices and contributions of military spouses.

•<u>Armed Forces Day</u>: Observed on the third Saturday of May, this day honors the men and women currently serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.

•Memorial Day: The last Monday of May, this federal holiday is a time to remember and honor the service and sacrifice of those who have died while serving in the military.

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## Life & Workforce Readiness

Naval Support Activity (NSA) Annapolis

NSA Annapolis performed a successful implementation of its School Age Care Youth Business Club project, funded by a \$1,000 grant from BGCA Money Matters. Ms. Cierra, a dedicated member of our Youth Center staff, spearheaded this initiative, which involved the children creating their own restaurants.

The children voted on the type of food to be served, with pizza & pasta and sushi emerging as the winners. Job applications were distributed and the children applied for various roles, including manager, cook, server, hostess, security and dishwasher. Ms. Cierra and Mr. Devon conducted interviews to select the most qualified candidates, after which offer letters detailing wages, titles and schedules were sent out by our HR manager, Ms. Autumn.

The children collaborated with Ms. April, our interior designer, to discuss their restaurant vision, including names and uniforms. They also worked with Ms. Talyn, our supply manager, to ensure they had all necessary supplies. As opening day approached, the children, guided by Marketing Manager Ms. Lauren, created a Yelp page to announce their opening day, operating hours and menu.

Training sessions were conducted by Accounting Manager Mr. Chris, covering topics such as timecards, overhead costs versus profit, direct deposit versus hard copy checks and food supply pricing. The children met with Ms. April again to finalize their aprons and uniforms with their restaurant logos. Two days before opening, all managers were present for a health inspection conducted by Ms. Erin.

All planning and implementation were completed in-house and under budget. The community will vote on the best restaurant, with the winner converting the cafeteria, preparing real food from the menu and inviting their families for a memorable evening.
