**Education Department Announces Multilingual Education Campaign** 

As part of its Raise the Bar: Create Pathways for Global Engagement initiative, the Department launched "Being Bilingual is a Superpower" to promote multilingual education and bolster high-quality language programs & a diverse multilingual educator workforce nationwide. This initiative, led by the Department's Office of English Language Acquisition (OELA), seeks to advance research-based bilingual education and language instruction in early learning settings and beyond. It also strives to further the understanding of bilingualism and biliteracy as an educational and economic imperative for student success, global competitiveness, and engagement. OELA hosted a convening with education leaders and stakeholders & the Department's efforts to provide every student a pathway to multilingualism. Additionally, the Secretary released a letter to families, educators, and school leaders to share resources for English learners, including Raise the Bar metrics and data visualizations, the completed English Language Family Toolkit (also available in Spanish, Chinese, and Arabic), and a Seal of Biliteracy infographic.
